Debra Nestel is Professor of Simulation Education in Healthcare, Monash Institute for Health and Clinical Education (MIHCE), Monash University, and Professor of Surgical Education, Department of Surgery, University of Melbourne, Australia.

Debra is Editor in Chief, Advances in Simulation (www.advancesinsimulation.com), the journal of the Society in Europe for Simulation Applied to Medicine (SESAM). She is program lead for the Master of Surgical Education (Department of Surgery, University of Melbourne and Royal Australasian College of Surgeons) and Master of Surgical Science (University of Melbourne) and Graduate Certificate in Clinical Simulation (Monash University).

She leads several short courses through MIHCE, the latest - Qualitative Research for Health Professions Education (QRHPE). Debra leads a national program for simulation educators – NHET-Sim (www.nhet-sim. edu.au) and a virtual network in simulated patient methodology (www.simulatedpatientnetwork.org).

Debra has published over 200 peer-reviewed papers in health professions education, edited books on simulated patient methodology (2015), healthcare simulation (2017), surgical education (to be published in 2019) and is working with colleagues on an edited book on research methods for healthcare simulation (for 2019) www.researchgate.net/profile/Debra\_Nestel

#### **PARKING**

#### **Parking on site**

If driving, parking is available on site at the Alfred Hospital (refer to map for locations). Prices range from \$9 - \$27 and is the cheapest all day parking in the area.

#### **Street Parking**

Some street parking is available in the surrounding streets and is metered Monday through to Saturday afternoon. Check signs for details.

#### **Other Local Carparks**

- 198 Punt Road (corner of Greville St and Punt Rd) offers 18 carspots, 2 hour blocks between 9am 6pm weekdays 5 min walk to hospital
- 182 Punt Road offers 44 carspots, 2 and 4 hour blocks between 9am 6pm weekdays
- There are a range of private car parking facilities in the area that are around \$40+ for a full day

#### **PUBLIC TRANSPORT**

#### Tram

- No. 72 stops in front of The Alfred main entrance and near The Alfred Centre entrance. Some offer wheelchair or disability access – there is no regular timetable for these specific trams
- No. 3, 5, 6, 64 and 67 stop on St Kilda Rd at the Commercial Road intersection which is a short walk from The Alfred.

#### Train

- · Prahran Station is within walking distance.
- Walk along Greville Street and then Punt Road to Commercial Road

#### Bus

- · No. 216, 219, 220 stop on Commercial Road
- No. 246 stops on Punt Road at the Commercial Road intersections and is a short walk to The Alfred
